REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
2.
 - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(the word "dog" includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. Saturday 13th March 2021. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) Withdrawal
The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1).19.
- (2) Transfer
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

YEARLING—For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

MID LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the Breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.

SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES: To be judged separate from the main show classes. Dogs must be previously entered in the main show before being entered into a SAC. Wins will not qualify to any awards gained in the main show classes. There will be no special award issued. (IE: Best of ...). SAC are being scheduled to assist novice judges with hands-on experience.

CHAMPION: For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion or Show Champion under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

JUDGE PROFILES

- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for Competition: Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. Remedial action will be taken by the Committee in the event of dogs being found in a distressed condition in vehicles.
21. Foul and Grooming Waste. Any person in charge of a dog must remove any faeces and/or grooming waste immediately. Please use designated areas where bins are provided for the disposal of waste.
22. No animal, other than the exhibits and those visiting for eye testing will be allowed within the precincts of the Show.
23. The Committee of the E.A.C.A. does not hold itself responsible for any loss or damage to persons, dogs or property whilst entering or leaving the Venue. Upon this understanding only are Entries received.
24. Parents will be responsible for the behaviour of their children within the precincts of our Show and Events.
25. If acknowledgement of entries is required a stamped self addressed postcard should be enclosed with entries for the Secretary's signature.
26. Should any question arise not provided for in these rules, the Committee's decision is final, subject to appeal to The Kennel Club.
27. No person whilst an undischarged bankrupt may serve on the Committee of, or hold any other Office or Appointment within a Kennel Club registered Society.

TRADE STANDS. The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by standholders at the Show and wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

EXERCISE AREA. Please respect the venue and use the Exercise Areas provided. Exhibitors/Owners are required to clear up any fouling by the dog(s) in their charge and to keep all dogs on leads whilst exercising.

MICK TAYLOR (BRUERNISH)

The Bruernish affix was granted in 1982, and in partnership with my wife, Sandra, we have owned and exhibited Bearded Collies for over thirty years.

I first judged Beardies in 1984, and awarded CCs for the first time in 1996. I have judged them on a regular basis both here and overseas, and also at Crufts 2019 when I judged the males and my wife judged the bitches, and yes, we did agree on BOB!

I am passed to award CCs in seven other Pastoral breeds and awarded my first set of Rough Collie CCs in 2015. I also judge the Pastoral Group at Championship Show Level.

It has been my good fortune over the years to have judged other breeds in the Pastoral and Working Groups. These include Australian Shepherds, Briards, Old English Sheepdogs, Rough Collies, Shetland Sheepdogs and Bouvier des Flandres. I also judge these Groups and Best in Show at Open Show level.

I am currently Chairman of National Working & Pastoral Breeds Society, having served on the committee in various positions over the last seventeen years.

I have always enjoyed judging Collies, both Rough and Smooth, and am looking forward to judging dogs at the East Anglian Collie Association in 2020.

ANNE SMITH (TENTOLA)

Nick and I rescued our first Rough in 1985 just after we got married, then added a second pup the following year: some of you may remember her, Bonnie Lass of Moyles at Tentola. Like most of us, within four years we were up to three Roughs then added our first Smooth, Ch Ghyllmoire Night Flame of Tentola. My lifelong love of the Collie was underway.

Over the next few years I enjoyed showing my dogs and being on the committee of Romford & DCS. We had our first Rough litter in 1991 and Smooth in 1993. My first judging appointment came in 1994 and I judged many Open shows over the next few years. In 1995 I joined the committee of EACA, so it is particularly poignant that my first CC appointment in Roughs is for our wonderful club. My first CC appointment in Smooths came in July 2007.

In 2003 we moved to Spain and started showing and judging FCI style. Over the years we imported several UK bred Roughs and they won 40+ CACIBs. We also always had at least one Smooth at home, all of whom became Multi Champions. I was an active member of the Gibraltar Kennel Club, judging for them on two occasions, plus other memorable appointments in Finland and Australia.

We moved back to the UK in August 2020 and we are really looking forward to getting back to the shows!

DAVID KNIGHTS (LELAPS)

Myself and my partner started showing Whippets after being encouraged to take our pet bitch to a ring-craft class. We showed the breed with some success, breeding a litter and qualifying two dogs for the stud book which was no mean feat in a strongly competitive breed.

The next breed to join us was a Cardigan Welsh Corgi who we showed with some success and an Afghan Hound who has won well at open and championship show level. Finnish Spitz joined our kennel 8 years ago and we have made up two champions in this breed.

I have been involved in show organisation for a number of years and am currently the Secretary of Newmarket and DCS, Chairman of EA Whippet Club and a committee member for the Basenji Club of GB.

I judge all the breeds in the hound group at open shows and have the honour of being invited to award CCs in 2021 and 2022 in Finnish Spitz and Whippets. I also judge several Pastoral breeds, including Rough and Smooth Collies, and I am currently on the C list for both breeds.

I am very much looking forward to judging the Special Award Classes at the East Anglian Collie Association championship show.

CODE OF ETHICS

- 1) Members shall maintain the best possible standards of health and environment for their dogs, not keeping more than they can properly care for.
- 2) Stud Dogs and Brood Bitches shall be in good health and condition, and ideally free from hereditary defects. Due consideration should be given to type and temperament before breeding a litter. Members shall strive to eradicate hereditary defects from the breed.
- 3) Bitches under the age of 15 months and over the age of 8 years shall not be used for breeding, and neither shall a bitch be bred from more than twice out of three successive seasons.
- 4) Every care shall be taken when selling puppies or older dogs, at home or abroad, ensuring that no stock is sold to laboratories, pet shops or dealers. Breeders shall also help with the re-homing of a dog, sold by them, should this become necessary.
- 5) Members are required to maintain and pass on to buyers of stock, accurate records of health, pedigree and registration documentation, as well as advice on feeding, rearing and general care for the dog.
- 6) Members must accept that, like people, dogs grow old and need special care and attention. They must therefore be prepared to love and care for a dog, for all its life whilst in their ownership.

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.00am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging of Rough Collie Dogs will commence at 10.00am; Bitches at 9.30am. Judging of Smooth Collies will commence at approx. 11.30am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all the judging has been completed.
5. Entry Fees:

Exhibitors applying for first time membership must complete an application form. All members are expected to abide by our Code of Ethics that can be found elsewhere in this Schedule.
6. There will be no Prize Money paid at this show except in the Stakes Class.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. Best Puppy in Show. Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified) A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.
11. Best in Show. The dog declared Best in Show must be selected from those dogs which have been declared Best of Breed (or Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified). Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Best of Breed(s) and the dog/bitch declared by the breed judge to be Reserve Best of Breed to the dog declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

1. Tick the box near your name and address on the front of the entry form if you do **NOT** want your **ADDRESS** to appear in the catalogue. Your name will still be printed above your dog records as normal.
2. Your address is still needed for the sending out of schedules and exhibitors passes. So you must still enter your address in the normal way.

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries: Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

CHEQUES

The Society name must be written in full or your cheque will be returned.

The banks are now scanning cheques as you pay them in. Cheques that are not written using black ink, or don't have the society name written in full, will be rejected. Failure to follow the above criteria means your entry will be returned.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

Unbenched SUB-GROUP CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW

Held under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Show Regulations
