

Dog fouling and grooming waste (animal)

Any owner, handler, exhibitor or other person, at any Kennel Club Licensed Show, in charge of a dog is required to immediately remove any fouling caused by their dog(s) and/or any grooming waste within the Licensed Venue and within the environs of that event, including car and caravan parks and approaches. The chalking, powdering or spraying (with the exception of water) of exhibits within the precincts of the show is forbidden.

Jurisdiction and responsibilities

The Officers and Committee members of the society holding the licence are deemed responsible for organising and conducting the show safely and in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Kennel Club and agree to abide by and adopt any decision of the Board or any authority to whom the Board may delegate its powers subject to the conditions of Regulation F17. In so doing those appointed as officers and committee members accept that they are jointly and severally responsible for the organisation of the show and that this is a binding undertaking (vide Kennel Club General Show Regulations F4 and 5).

The Society will ensure to the best of its ability that the event is run to Covid Safe guidelines. It is your responsibility to ensure you comply with national and local restrictions including advice given about non-essential travel in and out of locally affected regions (which must not be ignored) – in the interests of the safety of all participants this may give rise to a short notice refusal of entry at the society's discretion. The Kennel Club will respect the society's exercise of its discretion. If a competitor, or anyone in their household, has Covid-19 related symptoms or has tested positive for Covid-19 they must isolate in line with Government advice - www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/self-isolation-and-treatment/when-to-self-isolate-and-what-to-do/
The competitor must not attend the event.

18. Not For Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their appointment, the Committee reserve to themselves the right to appoint another to fulfil the duty. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees will be returned.
21. The Entrance fee of a dog entered but not sent to the show will be forfeited. If a dog is not at the ringside when required for judging, the committee will not be responsible for its absence from the show ring.
22. The Committee will not in any way, be responsible for any claim for injury or compensation or loss of property occasioned by or arising out of the holding of the Show.
23. The Committee is empowered to exclude any dog which is not in a fit state for competition from disease, savage disposition or any other causes and if such exclusion takes place before or after the dog is judged, the entry fee will be forfeited (Vide K.C. Reg. F (1) 15).
24. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
25. The Officers and Committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for the products advertised or sold by stand holders at the show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
26. Exhibitors are advised that the Officers and Committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for cash sent through the post.
27. **Bank Charges** – Exhibitors whose cheques are returned by their bank for any reason will be liable to settle the amounts due plus bank charges of £35.00 plus a fee of £10.00. Any unpaid amount will be reported to The Kennel Club.

Regulations for The Preparation of Dogs For Exhibition F (Annex B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A 42.
2.
 - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30 am unless otherwise advertised in the dog press.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed.
5. **Entry Fees: Members:** First entry £7.00 per dog; £1.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. **Non-Members:** First entry £9.50 per dog; £1.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Dogs Not For Competition £2.00 each (full details must be given on entry form). Catalogues £3.50 in advance; £4.00 on the day. Entries can be made online at www.highampress.co.uk.
6. There is no prize money on offer at this Show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
11. **Best in Show.** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.

About our Judge

Glenn Miller - Graftonbury

In 1972 I began to show my pet Irish (Red) Setter, with moderate success - mainly at open shows. This gave me a taste for showing dogs. However, it was not until more than two years later that I found my ideal breed: the English Springer Spaniel.

I started showing ESS in 1974, having purchased a young bitch named Hawkhill High Society.

1976: I bred my first litter of ESS, which contained my first show champion, Sh Ch Graftonbury Exquisite (3 CCs & 4 RCCs).

1979: My second litter contained Sh Ch Graftonbury Genghis Khan (25 CCs, 16 RCCs, 3 x group 1st including Crufts 1985, 1 x group 4th and 1 Reserve Best in Show at a General Ch Show, plus many BISs at Club Shows).

1981: My foundation bitch Sh Ch Hawkhill High Society, dam of the 2 above-mentioned litters (3 CCs & 1 RCC) gained her championship title. I also purchased Lady Sara of Graftonbury (1 CC & 3 RCCs), a daughter of my Genghis Khan.

1983: My third litter included Sh Ch Graftonbury the Ninja (4 CCs & 5 RCCs) and Graftonbury Princess Leia (4 RCCs).

I awarded CCs in ESS for the first time in the UK in 1985 and again in 1987. I have also judged at least 10 classes at open-show level in the following breeds between 1980 and 1985 (unfortunately, all records of these open shows have been lost): Irish Setters, English Setters, German Short-haired Pointers, Cocker Spaniels, Welsh Springer Spaniels, Labrador Retrievers, Flat-coated Retrievers, Golden Retrievers, English Pointers. Furthermore, I have judged at least 6 classes of the following breeds: American Cocker Spaniels, Clumber Spaniels, Hungarian Vizlas, Sussex Spaniels, Field Spaniels and Italian Spinone, with a minimum of 4 dogs per class present.

While living and working in Switzerland at kennel New Bellecombe, where we had a small show breeding team of Basset Hounds. I birthed and raised all the litters produced and prepared all the show dogs and handled them all over Europe including the UK. Winning over 30 CACs and CACIBs and 2 UK CCs between the years 2010-2018 and showing Multi Ch.-Int Ch. New Bellecombe Tuppence to her titles.

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

In accordance with Kennel Club guidelines, Exhibitors must display exhibit number/owner identification on their crate, cage or container at all times.

NOTE TO EXHIBITORS

This is an outdoor show,

Pop-ups and gazebos will be permitted (Maximum 3m x3m), in the designated areas, this will be indicated by signs.

Car parking is within 200m of the ring.

There is a Café on site that will be available for hot food.

Health and Safety Declaration

Exhibitors and spectators are reminded that just as The Midland Basset Hound Club has a responsibility to ensure the health and safety of all those attending their event. All those present have a duty and responsibility for their own safety. They are therefore expected to take the greatest care to avoid accidents with ring furniture (posts, tables, mats), uneven surfaces and other hazards, which are an inevitable and integral element of a dog show. Those bringing and using portable items of equipment such as folding chairs, trolleys, cages and grooming tables also have a responsibility to ensure that their tools, equipment and collapsible furniture is used and erected safely and does not constitute a hazard to others. Exhibitors are also reminded that they should wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the prevailing conditions on the site. Exhibitors show at their own risk if conditions are not ideal.

STEWARDS TO BE KEPT TO SAME 2 FOR WHOLE SHOW. MAINTAIN 1+ METRE SOCIAL DISTANCING GUIDELINE: BETWEEN THEMSELVES, JUDGE AND EXHIBITORS AT ALL TIMES. CONTACT OF ANY PAPERWORK TO BE KEPT TO A MINIMUM. EACH STEWARD WILL KEEP TO THE SAME ROLE ALL DAY TO AVOID THE POTENTIAL OF CROSS CONTAMINATION.

THERE WILL BE NO AWARD BOARD, AS PER KC GUIDELINES. THE JUDGE WILL BE ASKED TO PLACE THE SECRETARY'S COPY OF THE SLIPS FROM THE JUDGES BOOK IN A SEPARATE PLASTIC WALLET ONCE COMPLETED.

PRIZE CARDS AND ROSETTES FOR CLASSES TO BE COLLECTED FROM TABLE. NO ADDITIONAL PRIZES OF FOOD, MONEY, OR TROPHIES WILL GIVEN OUT IN THE RING.

THE AWARDED OF MAIN WINNERS' ROSETTES WILL BE PRESENTED BY THE JUDGE AT THE END, BOTH PARTIES ARE ADVISED TO USE ANTI-BACTERIAL HAND GEL AND MASKS.

EXHIBITORS TO BRING OWN MASK. GLOVES, ANTI-BACTERIAL HAND GEL, AND ANTI-BACTERIAL WIPES.

ALSO ADVISED TO BRING OWN CHAIRS.

RING NUMBERS TO BE LAID OUT AND COLLECTED FROM TABLE. EXHIBITORS WILL BE ADVISED TO ONLY COLLECT THEIR NUMBER AND NOT TOUCH ANY OTHER NUMBERS ON THE TABLE.

EXHIBITORS WILL BE REQUIRED TO KEEP AT LEAST 1+ METRE PART IN THE RING, AND ADVISED NOT TO WAIT AT THE ENTRANCE OR EXIT OF THE RING PRIOR TO THEIR CLASS BEEN CALLED. THE RING WILL BE CLEARED IN BETWEEN CLASSES PRIOR TO THE NEXT CLASS BEEN CALLED.

THOSE EXHIBITORS WISHING TO WAIT IN THEIR CARS, THE STEWARDS WILL ENSURE THAT EACH CLASS IS CLEARLY CALLED INSIDE AND OUTSIDE THE VENUE.

EXHIBITORS WILL NOT BE ABLE TO SIT RINGSIDE AND WILL BE REQUESTED TO STAY IN THEIR ALLOCATED AREA.

EXHIBITORS WILL BE ASKED TO KEEP MOVEMENT AROUND THE VENUE TO A MINIMUM WHERE POSSIBLE. EXHIBITORS ARE ADVISED BRINGING ADDITIONAL FAMILY MEMBERS TO A MINIMUM.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of **Postal** entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Wednesday 7th April 2021**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) *Transfer*

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of seven years and over on the first day of the Show.

NOT FOR COMPETITION: Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs of any breed that have not been entered in any other class. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

REMINDER

Dogs in cages must be identified by Name of the Exhibitor or Ring Number
